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Cost and red tape prevent tradespeople hiring apprentices

- Two thirds of tradespeople turning down work as they are so busy
- Affordability concerns are the top reason stopping tradespeople hiring apprentices
- Trade apprentices avoid costs associated with university and benefit from earning whilst they learn

Tradespeople are missing out on growth opportunities from hiring an apprentice because of perceived costs and red tape, new research from Screwfix has revealed.

Despite two thirds (66%) of builders, plumbers, electricians and other tradespeople turning down work because they are too busy, just 5% of those surveyed, currently hire an apprentice. Half of those said having an extra pair of hands has helped them take on additional work.

Research has found that the top reasons for not employing an apprentice were due to cost (33%), too much red tape (24%) and concerns about finding the right person to work with the team (17%).

John Mewett, CEO of Screwfix, commented: "These results show there is much more to do to help tradespeople overcome perceived challenges to hiring an apprentice.

"We know from our customers, that having an apprentice on site can be a real opportunity and support business growth. It allows tradespeople to take on more work while investing in the future generation, who will hopefully go on to become long-term employees. What's more, apprentices can earn while they learn and avoid costs associated with university, it's a great way to start a fulfilling career.
