Darren, of Coatbridge, North Lanarks, revealed: "It took me a year to come up with this idea and get it going but I hope

"If you can pay £12.99 a month, get any problems fixed by a professional roof tiler and not have to worry about forking out thousands for repairs, what's not to love?

"The customer is happy and they will stay with me forever, so we are both winners."

Darren's passion for his trade was also a key factor in his win. And he has roofing in his blood - his father and

grandfather were also both in the trade.

"I used to go out with my father on a Saturday as a kid," he laughs. "I was only paid £5 a shift but I loved it.

"All I ever wanted was to be the best roofer I could be."
