New Forest Mencap, based in New Milton, is celebrating after being awarded £5000 worth of funding from The Screwfix Foundation, a charity which supports projects to fix, repair, maintain and improve properties and facilities for those in need.

Warren Breach of New Forest Mencap comments: "We are very grateful to The Screwfix Foundation for donating these much-needed funds to support our charity. In 1969 a group of parents set up the charity for the benefit of their children. The plot was leased to them by the then Lymington Town Council on which they erected the Nedderman Centre. An extension was added in 1996 and the building has remained much the same since then. It houses leisure and educational activities, mainly for adults with a learning disability and provides a setting for the New Milton Stroke Group and other community activities.

The funding will be used towards installing an up-to-date hot water system and new radiators with thermostatic controls. We'd like to thank everyone who was involved in the fundraising – it's been a great help to us."
